

Construction consumables, exterior and interior joinery, wood structures, terraces, furnishing - whether visible or invisible, wood is a material that is very present throughout the construction industry. As part of our efforts to reduce our carbon footprint, the Bouygues Construction Group is increasing purchases of wood products to supply our construction sites.

Since 2015, Bouygues Construction has been a partner of WWF France and supports its "Reinventing the City" initiative, which aims to bring together businesses and communities around more sustainable urban lifestyles.

Within this framework, WWF France is supporting Bouygues Construction to achieve a more sustainable supply of wood. Objective: implement a system that reduces the risks of negative impacts from its wood supplies on the world's forests, together with the people who depend on them and the biodiversity they are home to, by purchasing greater quantities of certified - particularly FSC certified - wood.

3 main areas of work between Bouygues Construction and WWF France have been identified:

- wood supply mapping and risk analysis of wood purchased by the Group;
- support to consolidate a sustainable timber supply strategy;
- employee training and awareness through the implementation of decision support tools.

This partnership will help define Bouygues Construction's timber strategy, which will rely on our network of employees throughout our Operational Units.

"Forests are home to 80 percent of Earth's biodiversity and support 1.6 billion people, according to IUCN. Yet 7.6 million hectares of forest disappear every year, especially in tropical areas, according to the FAO. Bouygues Construction, in view of the volumes of wood purchased and its position as a leader in sustainable construction, has an important role to play in supporting the development of the responsible wood sector.

Through our partnership with Bouygues Construction, we aim to support its teams in securing the supply chain against deforestation and illegal logging, in order to preserve the integrity of the world's most important forests.

WWF France supports players like Bouygues Construction who are prepared to commit to a responsible wood procurement policy and encourages new players to join them.


